

'Need to tighten Mahikeng security'

PEOPLE coming in and going out of Mahikeng could soon be subjected to searches if the North West provincial government has its way.

This was announced by Premier Supra Mahumapelo as one of the outcomes of the recent provincial executive council (Exco) outcomes.

Mahumapelo said there was a need to tighten security in the provincial capital to make sure that residents were and felt safe.

"These searches must not only be done during the festive season but also throughout the year," he said.

"We want to send a clear message to criminals that we do not condone any behaviour that is not within the confines of the law."

Mahumapelo further said the province was in the process of moving the police headquarters to Mahikeng as well.

"I have been in talks with the Minister of Police Fikile Mbalula, because

we decided that it is important for the

provincial headquarters of the SAPS to move to Mahikeng.

"A change in police commissioners and construction of a new government precinct are some of the things which have been causing delays to this process because these police officials will need to be accommodated somewhere," Mahumapelo said.

The provincial government said it was aware that there was a huge problem of substance abuse in our communities. "We urge parents to always be aware of where their children are at all times and to talk to their children about issues such as alcohol and drug abuse.

"The department of education and sport development (Desed) will be working with the police on awareness campaigns to advise farmers and all those who reside in rural areas on how to take care of their animals.

Some of the preventative steps would be to clearly mark their animals and also make sure that their properties are well fenced.

During the festive season operations conducted from December 1-3, police im-

robberies in the Brits, Mahikeng and Rustenburg areas.

Stock theft, also continues to be a problem in the province. Mahumapelo said the provincial government had agreed to work with police on the 8th programme of the Sesokosane 10X10 Plan, which aims to fight crime, greed and corruption.

"We have been working with the department of finance, economy and enterprise development (Feed) to prevent the illegal sale of alcohol and we have closed some of these operations," he said.

In terms of stock theft, the department of rural environment and agricultural development (Read) will be working with the police on awareness campaigns to advise farmers and all those who reside in rural areas on how to take care of their animals.

He further said the police who successfully uncovered drug manufacturing labs in Boons, Madikwe and a government house in Riviera Park, should be applauded.

TRANSPORT Minister Joe Maswanganyi has urged traffic cops to ensure that motorists are safe on the roads.

The minister was speaking during a graduation ceremony for 161 cops at Mpumalanga Traffic Training College in Mkhulhu on Friday.

"You are graduating in the month that we launched a road safety campaign for the festive season," Maswanganyi told the traffic cops.

"It's unfortunate you didn't graduate in June, but in December.

"This month is very busy and from now on, we are on the roads together.

"You have a huge responsibility to ensure that road users drive safely."

Maswanganyi said that people are likely to drink and drive this

"Cellphones are also a challenge since a lot of accidents are caused by motorists who use phones while driving," said the minister.

Mpumalanga Safety MEC Pat Ngomane has urged the graduates to be trustworthy at all times, as they play an important role in keeping the roads safe.

Provincial police commissioner Lieutenant-General Mondli Zuma urged the graduates not to take bribes from motorists.

"Always lead by example," he said.
