

Road safety debate enters home stretch

THE national road safety debate and participatory education techniques (PET) competition enters the home stretch in Rustenburg today.

About 250 pupils representing schools from all over the country have been battling it out since Monday.

Community safety and transport management MEC Dr Mokgantshang Motlhabane is set to deliver a keynote address at the Orion Hotel later this evening.

His address draws the curtain on

the competition and will usher in the awards ceremony.

Department spokesperson Thabo Sematle said pupils were competing for first place in different categories but expectations were that everything would be done by the end of the day.

"The two competitions that are running concurrently started on Monday and will end with a prize giving today," Sematle said.

Motlhabane's speech is scheduled to commence at 6pm.
