ROAD safety was a not a transport issue, but a societal matter that could be overcome in the same manner the scourge of HIV and Aids was being dealt with, Transport Minister Joe Maswanganyi said.

He was addressing the second annual Youth Road Safety Summit in Centurion, attended by hundreds of young people from across the country.

"We agreed as a nation that HIV/Aids was not the responsibility of the Department of Health and we have come a long way in reducing the scourge.

"This is because all of us

"And this is what we're doing here; fighting this problem of road carnage, which is very high and costing the country a lot of money," he said.

Maswanganyi applauded the youth who he said since the first summit had been involved in road safety initiatives.

He called on the youth to look into being at the forefront of the development of the transport sector, which still had numerous opportunities for them instead of just employment opportunities.

This, he said, was due to the fact that the sector was still in dire need for transformation and the inclusivity of black people, youth, women and people with disabilities in particular.

8-man gang's airport robbery foiled

THE armed gang of eight must have thought they were about to pull off their daring cash-heist at OR Tambo International Airport.

Some dressed as airport security company guards, they entered the

cargo terminals.

Others, who arrived in two separate getaway vehicles, had taken control of the main gate while some took control of the Swissport warehouse, where they stole a truck loaded with cellphones.

But airport security guards were on the alert. They had been observing their moves and then pounced.

The drama unfolded at the airport on Saturday when airport security guards and SAPS officers foiled a heist by the heavily armed gang. One of them tried to make a dash, but was fatally wounded during a shoot-out with SAPS officers, said national police spokesperson Brigadier Vishnu Naidoo.

The police and guards' swift action earned them the praise of

"Minister Mbalula applauds the working relation of our security forces in fighting crime," said Police Ministry spokesperson Vuyo Mhaga.

Naidoo said the heist was thwarted after police were immediately informed by a crime-combating unit and acted promptly.

"Police were alerted through mechanisms which form part of the joint reactive strategies to combat robberies at the airport.'

Some of the would-be robbers were taken into custody, but others are still at large.

"The suspects fled in different directions."

'Two suspects fled on foot across the R21 highway," said Naidoo, adding that the Gauteng K9 unit tracked one down but he was later killed in a shoot-out.

Naidoo said two firearms, including a pistol and a revolver, were recovered from the suspects. Police were in discussion with the management of the warehouse about its accessibility and security to understand how the incident took place.

"Police will be continuing vig orous discussions with the manage ment of the warehouse security on .. the easy accessibility or the lack of protection thereof," he said.

Naidoo did not rule out the

possibility that the attempted rob bery might have been an inside job. Meanwhile, anti-crime activist Yusuf Abramjee also congratulated the police for their prompt action.

He said, however, that it was too soon for celebrations as too many robberies take place at the airport - a "haven for criminals".

"We shouldn't celebrate this as a major breakthrough, (because) the situation is out of control."

Abramjee's comments came in regards to a recent spate of robberies at OR Tambo International Airport.

THA P91 NWSARS POS Police report record arrests

THERE is a lot of ground to cover but provincial police said that progress has been made in fighting serious and violent crime including the hijacking of motor vehicles and house and business robberies in the province.

A record number of 226 people have been arrested and 135 cases related to the three crimes have been recorded

since April.

Police spokesperson Brig Sabata Mokgwabone said the province established "trio task teams" in areas such as Rustenburg, Mahikeng, Klerksdorp and Brits. He said these were areas where

those crimes were prevalent.

"At this stage and with implementation of the task teams, inroads have been made and critical successes achieved."

The arrested suspects include repeat offenders.

"In order to ensure interaction, successful prosecution and that the miscreants remain in custody, operational coordination worked hard to ensure the arrested persons were linked to other cases, not only in the North West but also in other provinces."

He said in Rustenburg, a man who was arrested on June 18 for car hijacking, was linked to a case in Gauteng.
