## Life imprisonment for rapist

Mahikeng Mail - Klerksdorp - The North West South African Police Service management welcomed a life imprisonment sentence handed down to Retshidisitswe Fokotsane (36) by the Klerksdorp Regional Court last Thursday.

In July 2016, a 38-year-old victim and her friend went to a dumping site in Klerksdorp where they met the accused. The latter was known to the victim. It was reported that the accused then asked the victim to accompany him to his house to collect meat for her and the others.

The accused, upon arrival at his house, took out an axe and threatened to cut the victim into pieces if she refused to undress. Fokotsane ultimately raped the victim as several times before taking her back to the dumping site the following day. The police were alerted about the incident and the accused was traced and arrested.

The North West Acting Provincial Commissioner, Major General Ryno Naidoo, applauded the investigating team for a sterling job. He indicated that crimes against women and children will not be tolerated and that perpetrators thereof will be dealt with harshly.



# Indefinite strike for 10111 call centre workers The ac lotted 1991 sats neg National

SOUTH Africans wanting to report emergencies will have to wait for long periods with 10111 call centre workers embarking on an indefinite strike.

The 10111 workers embarked on a nationwide strike yesterday after police management failed to meet their demands. At least 22 centres will be affected countrywide during the national strike. Emergency call centre operators according to the South African Policing Forum earn less than other government call centres.

They held a protest outside 10111 call centre headquarters at Corporate Park North in Midrand, chanting songs and carrying placards urging Minister of Police Fikile Mbalula to intervene.

South African Policing Union national negotiator Ali Tlou said they will be shutting down emergency centres because their members were promised they would be upgraded from level five to seven four years ago.

"We have been engaging the department of public services and administration since 2013 about this matter. Riah Phiyega who was (national police) commissioner then, also created the expectation that she would promote them. But a benchmark study needed to be conducted first," Tlou said. A protesting 10111 operator, Johanna Ndlovu, 54, said they have an overwhelming amount

of work as they handle calls from all over Gauteng. She had been working for Gauteng 10111 in Midrand for nine years.

"Working 23 years for the SAPS, no promotion and no benefits, we want the minister of police to come and experience what we are experiencing here. What we are doing is not to just please people outside, he needs to come and check our work properly maybe he can understand why we are doing this," Ndlovu said.

Thou said that an incident occurred on Tuesday night where a senior police official allegedly abused her powers by attacking an employee who needed to go to the hospital. A case has been opened with the police. "If it is indeed true that the employee was attacked what should happen is the member needs to be suspended because this is common assault," he said.

Police spokesperson Sally de Beer said that uniformed members had been brought in to man the phones and there were no disruptions to the service.

"Operations continue to run smoothly across all provinces despite the strike. Our call centres have not been disrupted, the situation is being monitored and all contingency plans are in place," De Beer said. She said there were fewer than 1000 employees who were on strike.

The New Age yesterday dialled 10111 and the reporter had to drop the call without a response after a five-minute wait.

### SAPS hotline agents on strike over salaries

EVEN though the automatic recorded voice for the 10111 number says an operator will "attend to your call shortly", that will not be any time soon as emergency call centre operators working for the nationwide helpline officially downed tools yesterday.

They claimed they had been denied salary increases for four years.

The general secretary for the South African Policing Union (Sapu), Oscar Skommere, said the workers were determined to fight the "cruelty and injustice" being meted out to them by the SAPS on all fronts.

Skommere said the workers had taken the decision to down tools even though arbitration processes regarding their salaries were still under way.

"The workers have been waiting for four years for the employer to honour the recommendations of the task team set up by former national police commissioner General Riah Phiyega in 2013," Skommere said.

The task team set up by Phiyega conducted benchmarking against Home Affairs, Sassa, Sars, Crimestop and the Presidential hotline call centres.

In its findings, it recommended that workers be upgraded to salary level seven to earn R226 211 per annum.

However, the recommendations were not implemented as the former acting commissioner, General Khomotso Phahlane, announced that the workers would be converted into an essential service. The Police and Prisons Civil Rights Union (Popcru), however, cautioned its members not to take part in the strike.

Richard Mamabolo, Popcru spokesperson, said the organisation had advised its members not to take part in any strike action taken by other unions as they felt they had taken a populist and covert stance.

"Their stance is solely aimed at creating a false impression that they have numbers and can take the employer head-on," said Mamabolo.
