Maloyi introduces number plate recognition vehicle

In a bid to strengthen Jaws operation to achieve the mission of making North West a crime and accident free Province, Human Settlements, Public Safety and Liaison MEC Nono Maloyi has introduced a Mobile Automatic Number Plate Recognition System (ANPR) vehicle.

According to Maloyi this vehicle has SAPS circulation system, vehicle circulation and eNatis requirements which detects stolen vehicles and whether the car license disc has expired.

“This vehicle is going to be on the road 24/7 to make sure that are no unroadworthy vehicles on our roads and those who always lie to us that they have forgotten drivers license at home or in another car. Through the eNatis requirements system in the vehicle we will be able to check whether you have a drivers license or no. And if we find that you don’t have it we are going to issue a maximum fine, impound the car and you will only get it when you come with a licensed driver,” warned Maloyi.

Meanwhile, MEC Maloyi has further requested all law enforcement officers in the province to serve with respect, dignity, commitment and dedication.

“We need patriotic man and woman in uniform who can make people of South Africa proud and safe about their surroundings,” he said.

MEC Maloyi further said he will join operations and will also be on roadblocks that will be held in 24 hours across the province to advocate road safety.
