tourist guiding professionally and that the whole experience was eye opening.

"The skills I have acquired will assist me a lot as there are ample opportunities within

the tourism guiding sector and also there are economic opportunities for me to be my

own boss and run my own tour operations company. The course has also assisted in

expanding my knowledge with regards to available opportunities within the tourist

guiding sector. I will now be an active participant within the sector knowing that I

have adequate skills to be an instrumental contributor with adequate skill", said

Macucwa.

said that this well in line with her department's growth, developmental and

transformational agenda.
