I wish to commend the people of Ipelegeng for their patience and support. You did not join those who whine at everything and anything. Your patience and confidence in the ANC government has paid off.

Today you are reaping the fruits of our hard-earned democracy, hardwork, dedication and patience. In many ways than one, today's handover is a pledge redeemed, a promise fulfilled, a dream come true, and indeed a mission accomplished for the learners, educators and the community of lpelegeng.

In investing in the most fundamental building block of this community's education, Government has spent R7, 8 million for the construction of the First Phase of Reabetswe Senior Secondary School. This phase consisted of 12 classrooms, an administration block, a computer room and 36 toilets. Fifty-six (56) locals and a sub-contractor for steelwork were employed on the project for the construction of the school.

We wish to congratulate the Professional team led by W.P Jacobs and J.C. Nel Quantity Surveyors, Moedi Consulting Engineers and Kitso Technologies. Let me also commend TJ Moche Builders, Koma Electrical contractor, the Community Liaison Officer, Ms Mmatshabi Madito, our own Internal Project Manager, Mrs. Emelda Mati and the Director Building, Mr JJ Tselane for a job well done.

We hope that this school will produce Civil and Structural Engineers, Architects, Quantity Surveyors and Project Managers that the construction industry needs to meet the shortage of skills for major capital projects on infrastructure and the developmental needs of our country.

I call upon the community to invest its time and efforts in ensuring that this school is free from crime and vandalism, that drugs are not allowed on its premises, that the grounds, furnisher, textbooks and equipment are looked after, that the operation and ethos of the school reflect our constitutional values, that the achievement of its learners continue to improve, that the behaviour of its educators is exemplary, and that the country can share the pride of this community in its school and the education it instills.

It is my honour to hand over keys to the Mayor of Mamusa Local Municipality Honourable Councillor Gincane to officially open the school on behalf of the MEC for Education, Hon Rev. O.J. Tselapedi.
