- Development of procedure manuals and policies as per Treasury Regulation

- Implementation of the Public Financial Management Act
- Debt management and revenue collection
- Reconciliation and clearance of suspense accounts
- Improved management of the Departmental tender committee

As a department we are convinced that with the support of honourable members of this august house and in particular honourable members of the Portfolio Committee on Public Works in the exercise of their oversight duties and functions, and working in partnership with the construction industry, our strategy to achieve an enabling environment for the industry through the development of capacity, the removal of obstacles and the creation of new opportunities and relationships, which expand the potential to more development objectives, is achievable.

That the Department managed to spend 98% of its allocated budget in the financial year under review and received its first ever-unqualified audit report reinforces our assertion that indeed the tide has turned at Public Works. There is no turning back.

The People's Contract and our flagship the Expanded Public Works programme requires us as a coordinating department for the programme to fight poverty, unemployment and underdevelopment within an integrated and co-ordinated approach with vigour and determination. To us failure is not an option.

As President Mbeki and Premier Mme Molewa said, There is no room for failure because the masses of our people deserve better services, nothing but improved and better services and as a department we have no intention to fail them because we have understood the message that-

failure is not an option. As the African genius and Poet, Ben Okri said;
